Malaysia to train Lesotho's police officers and diplomats

PUTRAJAYA: Lesotho has requested that Malaysia provides training for its police officers, especially in areas of public order and security.

"I'm delighted to inform that the Malaysian government stand ready to support this request by sending a few of our trainers and this training programme will begin soon," Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak said.

He also said Malaysia had accepted Lesotho's request that its diplomats undergo training at the Institute of Diplomacy And Foreign Relations (IDFR) here.

"The training programme will begin in October this year and Lesotho is welcome to send some of its diplomats here for the programme," he added.

These were among the outcome of talks between Najib and his Lesotho counterpart Pakalitha Mosisili Thursday.

"We've had a very fruitful and interesting bilateral discussion. We have explored new bilateral cooperation and the prime minister (Mosisili) is very keen that Malaysia continue to support Lesotho, especially in human capital development and training."
